**Auditorium classes:** When starting the exercises, students are required to prepare in the scope indicated each time by the instructor (e.g., in the form of problem sets). The assessment of a student's work may be based on oral or written responses in the form of a quiz, which, according to the AGH University of Science and Technology regulations, translates into the final grade for this form of classes.

**Field-based learning experiences:** are a component of the course, contributing to the fulfillment of learning objectives. The workload (in hours) is specified by the instructor at the start of the semester. Both students and instructors participate in fieldwork sessions. Supervision begins at the designated meeting point upon the instructor's announcement and continues until all daily tasks are completed and the instructor officially concludes the session. Students are solely responsible for their health and safety during individual travel to and from the fieldwork location.
